















Rom. 3:25 "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."









"Although I myself might have <u>confidence even in the flesh</u>. If anyone else has a mind to put confidence in the flesh, <u>I far more</u>: circumcised the eighth day, of the nation of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the Law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to the righteousness which is in the Law, <u>found blameless</u>.

<u>But</u> whatever things were gain to me, those things I have counted as loss for the sake of Christ. More than that, I count all things to be loss in view of the <u>surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord</u>, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them but <u>rubbish</u> so that I may gain Christ, and may be found in Him, <u>not having a righteousness of my own derived from the Law, but that which is through faith in Christ</u>, the righteousness which comes from God on the basis of faith,
